Tournament Format Change

We have made a change to our schedule format. This year the first squad of each day will be Team Event and the second squad will be a 6 game format of Singles and Doubles. This helps the bowling center hosting our tournament to schedule their lanes and allow open play during prime open play hours. It also allows our participants to bowl all 9 games in one day if they so desire. We understand that some individuals desire to bowl doubles with more then one partner and will work with those individuals to manually schedule them as a pre-arranged walk in. It is important to remember when you register on line for Singles/Doubles event you will be registering for both events. If you have questions about this new format please contact us.

Everyone wants to win awards and be recognized for their achievements.

USBC recognizes the big achievements like bowling your first 300 game or first 800 series. Most of the awards bowlers received through out the season are provided by our local association GPUSBC. Funding for awards come from the local bowling fees.

Each year the GPUSBC Awards Committee attempts to select awards that bowlers will enjoy receiving. We try to change it up while keeping the cost under consideration. The committee is always open to suggestions. Feel free to send us an email if you have an idea you would like us to evaluate.

Make sure your secretary is informed when you are eligible for special awards. They won't be able to see a clean game or split conversion from the recap sheet.

8,307 awards were processed through our local association last year, with 88 of them being 300 Games and 33 800 Series Awards.

Generally awards are distributed to the league secretary within 30 days of earning the award. GPUSBC has strict guidelines for awards but we rely on league secretaries to submit the required documen-

tation in a timely manner.

BVL was founded in 1942 to help support America's heroes in uniform. Since then, we have raised over \$50 million to provide recreational and therapeutic programs and services. Now they can step away from the stress of service and have fun with their comrades. Through funding and support, these veterans recuperating at VA Medical Centers across the country can enjoy a movie, spend the afternoon hanging at a ball game, play a video game, be visited by friendly Labrador, or try their hand at painting.

Ways to Help

GPUSBC raises money every year for BVL. We hold a BVL Charity tournament which is scheduled to be held on 12 November at King Pins Portland. Entries are limited to the first 120 so please get your entries in early. The cost is only \$25.

The week of Veterans Day we send envelopes around to each league secretary and ask that they pass the envelope around to their bowlers to donate money. Some leagues donate their 50/50 proceeds from that week.

Note to secretaries: Envelopes will be delivered to centers the last week of October.
